

Equine welfare fund marks 10 years

In 2007, Angel, an ex-racehorse, was emaciated and set for slaughter when a Good Samaritan took her home and later donated her to Friends of Ferdinand, Inc., a thoroughbred rescue facility in Indiana. A support grant from Brennan Equine Welfare Fund, a charitable organization established in 2000 through The Greater Cincinnati Foundation, allows Angel to live out her years in a foster home with a wonderful family, a small herd, and 20 acres of rolling pastures.

The fund, which provides moneys to qualifying equine rescue, retraining, rehabilitation and retirement facilities, celebrates 10 years of helping horses like Angel and invites the public to make a \$10 tax-deductible donation so that no equine would be neglected or headed for a feedlot, with slaughter as the final destination.
